I'm not going to contact the prime minister yet. I need him to confirm that he wrote an article in the 'Independent' newspaper because of an email I sent to Eric Pickles on the 3rd February 2010. Pickles was chairman of the Conservative party at the time, he's a minister now. Pickles did a video because of the email as well. The PM is probably a bit busy so I'll contact him later, but I have all the details and they will go in the appeal package. The email to Eric included the address for my personal website that covers my power to the petition'. I'll let you see the email if you want, then you'll understand the connection.

I've got a couple of other bits to get as well. You know what is involved in preparing this sort of thing; you've seen me do it, but most of the work is done. It's just a matter of getting things confirmed. I don't mind you seeing the letters and emails I already have.

What happens next is up to you.

If you keep on fighting me this goes to appeal Tuesday/Wednesday, and in the end you lose. You have seen my case and you are starting to see the evidence. I will have you charged with perjury because it is then easy to overturn the assault charge if a key prosecution witness is in prison for lying! The campaign goes ahead, I'm a hero, and you're not very popular. Something of an understatement.

If you try and stir things up with the politicians the appeal goes ahead anyway and you lose. Everything takes a bit longer but in the end you just dig yourself a deeper hole. If you try and stir things up with the court it goes to Judge Hughes. You need to remember what I told you about Judge Hughes. He does not like you.

The alternative is that we can pretend you have decided to help me because you regret what has happened and want to put things right. That can be included in the appeal. I'm not going to delay anything so you have to be very quick, as I have to assume you'll do nothing, or try and cause trouble.

If you help me you can come out of this looking OK. Getting you out of this mess is complicated so we need to discuss it over a cup of coffee in town.
